#### MUNICIPAL TAXES DEFERRED

The Pontiac Municipal Council has decided to defer payment of municipal taxes to help taxpayers get through the Coronavirus crisis.

During a municipal council meeting held by telephone on March 25, 2020, the elected members have unanimously decided to allow the deferral of the payment of municipal taxes due on June 1,2020 for all Pontiac taxpayers, including businesses, whose account is not in arrears as of May 31, 2020.

« Many households will experience a significant decrease in their income, and as a municipality, we have more than a moral obligation to join our efforts to help each other », explains the Mayor Joanne Labadie.

Property owners will have until August 1, 2020, to make their payment, without interest.
