REPORT TABLED BY MAYOR ROGER LAROSE AT THE REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING OF NOVEMBER 11, 2014 REGARDING THE FINANCES OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF PONTIAC

To the members of Council and ratepayers,

I am happy to present the annual report on the Municipality's financial situation.

In accordance with article 955 of the Municipal Code, a report of the Municipality's financial situation must be presented by the mayor at least four weeks before the budget is tabled for adoption by council.

<u>2013</u>

For the period ending December 31, 2013, the verified financial statements show revenues of \$6, 784, 320.00, charges of \$7, 014, 447.00 and adjustments for fiscal purposes of \$101, 835.00, leaving a deficit of \$128, 292.00 which has been partly reimbursed with the non-appropriated surplus leaving a deficit of \$11, 290.00.

The accumulated surplus after adjustments is detailed as follows:

Appropriated surplus \$384, 417.00 Financial reserves \$81, 604.00 Reserved funds \$488, 695.00

2014- Preliminary results

Considering the financial commitments already recorded, the preliminary results for 2014 tentatively show that there will be a surplus.

Three-year capital program

As provided for when adopting the three-year capital program for 2014-2015-2016, the municipality purchased a new pumper fire truck during the year 2014, which allows our fire department to offer a better coverage of the territory. Other investments with respect to fire prevention foreseen in the last three-year program will be transferred over into the next three-year program for 2015-2016-2017, in particular for the improvement of the fleet of vehicles, the communications system and the fire halls.

For the Public Works Department, several paving projects as well as the municipalisation of certain roads had been forecasted for the year 2014. In view of the new requirements related to the tendering process, the municipality has taken the time during this year to review its procedures thanks to the engineers that were hired on a temporary basis. It is possible that a permanent position for an engineer will be created in 2015, and thanks to the work done in 2014, the municipality plans to go to tender for repairs of 4 kilometres on de la Montagne road during the Spring of 2015. Other projects for repairs that had been foreseen for 2014 will be given priority in 2015 that is, asphalting the roads in the Lusk project and Braun road – all of which is conditional to the adoption of a borrowing by-law. As for the municipalisation of certain roads, in 2015 the municipality will pursue its efforts by beginning with the analysis of roads that can be municipalized in partnership with the relevant associations. On the other hand, the purchase of a grader that is planned for 2016 could take place in 2015.

With respect to public hygiene, the Terratubes project that was foreseen for 2014 did not take place, but the treatment of waste water and septic tank sludge remains a priority for the next three-year program, and the municipality could invest as much in the treatment of waste water and septic tank sludge as in the purification of drinking water, in order to enhance the advantages that these services represent for a municipality like ours. The government has reserved the sum of 1.75\$M for our municipality until 2018 for projects pertaining to our infrastructures focused mainly on water treatment. The year 2015 will be a year for preparing important work that could begin in 2016.

Concerning recreation, the file on the community centre remains a priority in 2015 and the study that was completed in 2014 has allowed the municipality to have a reliable estimate of possible expenses for repairs to the community centre in the village of Quyon. On the other hand, the municipality could work

on the rehabilitation of the boat launch situated in the village of Quyon, while analyzing the possibility of formalizing and creating other accesses to the Ottawa River in 2015.

Preliminary orientations in 2015

In addition to the priorities identified in the three-year program, the Municipality of Pontiac will need to overcome several budgetary challenges in 2015. First of all, there is the new tax agreement decreed by the Quebec government that could mean a shift of the tax burden equivalent to 1.2% of the municipality's global budget. The municipality will have to absorb the impact of this transient tax burden, while implementing the necessary resources to better serve the population in the maintenance of roads and road repairs, land-use management and services in recreation, as well as the fire department. This new tax agreement could mean an increase in shares paid to the MRC des Collines-de-l'Outaouais that has been assigned new responsibilities by the Quebec government. On its own, the share for the MRC (which includes Public Safety (Police)) usually represents 25% of the total annual budget. The municipality hopes to meet these challenges while maintaining a competitive tax level that traditionally has been the lowest in the region and in other municipalities of similar sizes elsewhere in the province.

Pre-budget consultation

A pre-budget public consultation will take place at the Luskville Community Center located at 2024 route 148, Pontiac. The date and time will be disclosed soon.

Adoption of the 2015 budget

The final budget for the year 2015 will be adopted December 16, 2014 at 7:30 p.m. at the Luskville Community Centre. I invite all ratepayers to attend this meeting in order be better informed.
