

PROPOSED BY-LAW NUMBER 104-90

REGARDING THE PAYMENT OF A TRANSITIONAL ALLOWANCE
FOLLOWING THE DEPARTURE OF THE MAYOR

WHEREAS proposed by-law 24 sanctioned on July 17, 1988 foresees that a municipal Council can, by way of a by-law, pay a transitional allowance to any person who ceases to occupy the post of Mayor after having occupied said post at least 24 months prior to the termination of his mandate;

WHEREAS a notice of by-law was tabled at the meeting held June 4, 1990 according to the above-mentioned bill;

IT IS BY THE PRESENT BY-LAW ORDERED AND STATUED AND THE PRESENT BY-LAW ORDERS AND STATUES AS FOLLOWS:

Article 1:

This Council decrees that a transitional allowance will be payed to any person who ceases to occupy the post of Mayor after having occupied said post at least 24 months prior to the termination of his mandate and this, as defined in article 2 of the present by-law.

Article 2:

The amount of allowance is equal to the amount obtained by multiplying the bimonthly salary payed at the end of his mandate by the number of complete years said post was occupied by this person; the amount of allowance is increased by the portion of the bimonthly salary which is proportional to the portion of a year during which the person occupied the post including the number of completed years of service. The allowance cannot exceed four times the amount of bimonthly salary of the person at the end of his mandate.

Article 3:

Council must set the terms of payment of said allowance.

Article 4:

The present by-law will become in force according to law on the day of its publication.
