Support for homeowners and tenants affected by a disaster

How to make a claim for financial support and compensation?

- Owners and tenants of main residence can file for financial assistance and compensation online at Québec.ca: <a href="https://www.quebec.ca/en/public-safety-emergencies/emergency-situations-disasters-and-natural-hazards/financial-assistance-and-compensation-flooding-or-disaster/financial-assistance-compensation-property-owners-tenants
- Disaster victims can also apply for financial assistance and compensation via e-mail or by mail by sending the form and documents available on Québec.ca to the following address:

What is the deadline to file a request for financial assistance and compensation?

• A disaster victim has 3 months after the date of implementation of the General Disaster Financial Assistance Program (PGAF) in the municipality to file a claim.

Is it necessary to take pictures of the damages?

A flood damage inventory will be requested by the Ministry of Public Safety (MSP).

When to start cleaning and demolition work?

- As soon as the home is reinstated and after an inventory of the premises documented by photos and videos has been completed, it is advisable to begin cleanup and demolition to reduce the impact of the flood on:
 - Residents' health (mould and other contaminants);
 - The residence (degradation of structures and materials due to the presence of stagnant water).

- Reintegration can be done if the authorities allow it and if security is not compromised.

Can an evacuee who finds emergency shelter on his or her own be compensated for the cost of this relocation?

- For disaster victims who have been evacuated and not relocated to an emergency shelter provided by the Municipality, the PGAF provides an allowance of \$40* per day per person for days 4 to 100.
- This emergency accommodation can be in a hotel, a rental or with relatives.

- After the 100th day and if the claimant is still unable to return home, he or she should contact the analyst responsible for her or his file.

Is a secondary residence eligible to the PGAF?

- Secondary residences are not eligible to the PGAF.
- However, if a secondary residence is a rental building, it may be eligible.
