6.4 Cancellation of municipal tax balances – Fabrique de la paroisse Saint-Dominique

WHEREAS a memorandum of understanding was entered into between the Municipality of Pontiac and the Fabrique de la paroisse Saint-Dominique regarding the transfer of Saint-Dominique Church and the presbytery;

WHEREAS the deed of transfer was signed on December 17, 2025;

WHEREAS, during the negotiations leading to the transfer of the property, the parties agreed that the Municipality would assume the outstanding municipal taxes relating to the property for the years 2024 and 2025, as well as any other amounts owing at the time, where applicable;

WHEREAS this provision was not, however, included in either the memorandum of understanding or the deed of transfer;

WHEREAS Council considers it appropriate to give effect to this agreement and to regularize the taxation records associated with the former roll numbers of the Fabrique de la paroisse Saint-Dominique;

THEREFORE, it is moved by Councillor Garry Dagenais and seconded by Councillor Chantal Allen.

AND RESOLVED THAT Council authorize the cancellation of the outstanding municipal tax balances, interest, service charges and penalties applicable to former roll numbers 4243 58 6765, 4243 58 6766 and 4243 58 6767, corresponding to Saint-Dominique Church, the Presbytery and the Saint-Vincent de Paul, formerly owned by the Fabrique de la paroisse Saint-Dominique prior to their acquisition by the Municipality, for a total amount of \$5,315.04;

THAT the Finance Department be authorized to make the necessary adjustments to the taxation records in order to cancel these amounts;

THAT this resolution is intended to give effect to the agreement reached between the parties during the transfer of the property and to regularize the taxation records in accordance with that agreement.

6.6 Presbytery connection works to a septic system

WHEREAS the Municipality wishes to carry out these works in-house in order to optimize the use of its human and material resources while reducing costs;

AND RESOLVED THAT Council mandates the Public Works Department to carry out, in-house, the work required to connect the presbytery to a new septic system, in accordance with the applicable plans and approvals.



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THAT the Director General be authorized to purchase the required materials and incur the expenses necessary to complete the work, up to a maximum amount of \$15,000, in accordance with the Municipality's procurement policies and the available budgetary appropriations.

7.3 Training - 2026 Financial Assistance Program for the Training of Firefighters

WHEREAS the Regulation respecting the conditions for carrying out duties within a municipal fire safety service establishes the training requirements for firefighters in fire safety services in order to ensure a minimum level of professional qualification;



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WHEREAS this Regulation reflects a commitment to ensuring that municipalities have fire service teams whose members possess the skills and competencies necessary to respond effectively in emergency situations;

WHEREAS, in April 2024, the Government of Quebec renewed the Financial Assistance Program for the Training of Firefighters;

WHEREAS the objective of the Program is to promote, throughout Quebec, the acquisition of the skills and competencies required, among other things, by the Regulation, in order to maintain a sufficient number of qualified firefighters serving in municipal fire safety services who can respond effectively and safely to fires, disasters, and emergency situations, thereby reducing the impacts on life, property, and the environment;

WHEREAS the Municipality of Pontiac wishes to benefit from the financial assistance offered under this Program;

WHEREAS the Municipality of Pontiac plans to provide Firefighter I training to five (5) firefighters during the coming year in order to ensure an effective and safe response to emergency situations within its territory;

WHEREAS the Municipality must submit its application to the ministère de la Sécurité publique through the MRC des Collines-de-l'Outaouais in accordance with Section 4.2 of the Program;

THEREFORE, it is moved by Councillor Garry Dagenais and seconded by Councillor Chantal Allen.

AND RESOLVED THAT the Municipality submit an application for financial assistance under the Financial Assistance Program for the Training of Firefighters to the ministère de la Sécurité publique and forward the application to the MRC des Collines-de-l'Outaouais.

8.7 Renewal of the GPS system contract

WHEREAS Contract No. 2727 is dated April 13, 2022;

WHEREAS the contract contains a clause stipulating that, unless either party provides the other with written notice at least thirty (30) days prior to the contract expiry date, the contract shall be automatically renewed under the same terms and conditions for a period equivalent to the original contract, namely three (3) years;

8.8 Installation of a speed display signs on chemin de l'Hôtel-de-Ville

WHEREAS chemin de l'Hôtel-de-Ville is travelled daily by residents, motorists, and the many visitors travelling to Luskville Falls, a major tourist attraction;

WHEREAS the increased traffic volume on this road, particularly during the summer season, results in higher vehicle traffic;

WHEREAS several residents have expressed concerns regarding the speed at which some motorists travel along this road;

WHEREAS the installation of speed display signs is an essential measure to encourage compliance with the posted speed limit and to improve road safety for all road users;

THEREFORE, it is moved by Councillor Garry Dagenais and seconded by Councillor Scott McDonald.

AND RESOLVED THAT the Municipal Council authorize the installation of 40 km/h speed display signs on chemin de l'Hôtel-de-Ville, at locations to be determined by the Public Works Department, in order to encourage motorists to comply with the posted speed limit and to contribute to improved road safety.

8.9 Authorization to purchase equipment for the Public Works Department

WHEREAS the Municipality of Pontiac wished to acquire equipment for the Public Works Department and had mandated the Director General to proceed with the process;

WHEREAS a 2020 International HV613 truck, equipped for the collection of residual waste, was listed for sale on GovDeals;

9.1 Minor variance – 12 chemin du Cari – lot 5 815 585 and 173 chemin de la Coriandre – lot 5 815 593

WHEREAS an application for a minor variance was submitted on March 6, 2026, concerning Lots 5 815 585 and 5 815 593 of the Quebec Cadastre, located at 12 chemin du Cari and 173 chemin de la Coriandre, for the purpose of reducing the minimum lot area requirement following the merger of the two lots;

WHEREAS the property is located within Zone R-07 and must comply with the minimum lot area standards prescribed for that zone;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 33 of subdivision bylaw No. 13-24, the minimum standards applicable to an unserviced lot located outside the urban perimeter require a minimum lot width of 45 m and a minimum average lot depth of 60 m;

WHEREAS the property located at 12 chemin du Cari currently has an area of 578.0 m², a frontage of 24.38 m, and an average depth of 24.38 m;

WHEREAS the property located at 173 chemin de la Coriandre currently has an area of 696.4 m², a frontage of 15.24 m, and an average depth of 45.72 m;

WHEREAS the merger of the two lots will create a new lot with an area of 1,274.4 m², a frontage of 24.38 m, and an average depth of 70.1 m;

WHEREAS the merger will improve the current situation by bringing the lot closer to the prescribed standards and moving it toward compliance;

WHEREAS the Planning Advisory Committee (PAC) issued a favourable recommendation at its meeting of May 26, 2026;



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THEREFORE, it is moved by Councillor Dr. Jean Amyotte and seconded by Councillor Jean Côté.

AND RESOLVED THAT Council approve the application for a minor variance to permit a reduction in the minimum lot area requirement to 1,274.4 m² and a reduction in the minimum lot width requirement to 24.38 m instead of 45 m, following the merger of the properties located at 12 chemin du Cari and 173 chemin de la Coriandre, being Lots 5 815 585 and 5 815 593 of the Quebec Cadastre.

9.2 Subdivision – 12 chemin du Cari – lots 5 815 585 and 173 chemin de la Coriandre – lot 5 815 593

WHEREAS an application for a subdivision permit was submitted on March 6, 2026, concerning lots 5 815 585 and 5 815 593 of the Quebec Cadastre, located at 12 chemin du Cari and 173 chemin de la Coriandre, for the purpose of merging them into one (1) single lot;

WHEREAS the cadastral operation does not result in any increase in the number of lots on which a new principal building may be constructed;

WHEREAS the subdivision project does not require the dedication, free of charge, of one or more parcels of land representing 10% of the total area of the subdivided lots, nor the payment to the Municipality of an amount representing 10% of the value of all subdivided lots, in accordance with Section 37 of subdivision bylaw 13-24;

WHEREAS the property located at 173 chemin de la Coriandre, namely lot 5 815 593, is a vacant lot;

WHEREAS a minor variance was granted under resolution 26-06-5906 to reduce the lot area to 1,274.4 m² instead of 3,700 m² and to reduce the lot frontage to 24.38 m instead of 45 m, following the merger of the two (2) lots;

WHEREAS the merger of the two (2) lots will result in a lot area that moves toward compliance;

THEREFORE, it is moved by Councillor Dr. Jean Amyotte and seconded by Councillor Jean Côté.

AND RESOLVED THAT Council approves the subdivision application for 12 chemin du Cari and 173 chemin de la Coriandre, being lots 5 815 585 and 5 815 593 of the Quebec Cadastre, in order to create new lot 6 660 978, as shown on the proposed subdivision plan prepared by land surveyor Hubert Carpentier, dated November 12, 2024, under Minute 19363.

9.3 Amended subdivision plan – 75 chemin Terry-Fox – lots 2 684 246 and 2 872 145

WHEREAS an application for a subdivision permit submitted by Construction Jason Hynes Inc., concerning lots 2 684 246 and 2 872 145 of the Quebec Cadastre, located at 75 chemin Terry-Fox, was approved under resolution No. 25-02-5518 for the purpose of creating five (5) new lots, as shown on the plan prepared by Michel Fortin, Land Surveyor, dated September 10, 2024, under minute 34736;

WHEREAS Mr. Michel Fortin, Land Surveyor, was unable to complete the mandate entrusted to him by the developer;

WHEREAS the two (2) land surveyors did not reach an agreement to use the same proposed lot numbers (N.O.);

WHEREAS the developer retained a new land surveyor, Mr. Steve Tremblay, to resume the work, without notifying the Municipality of this change;

THEREFORE, it is moved by Councillor Dr. Jean Amyotte and seconded by Councillor Jean Côté.

AND RESOLVED THAT the issuance of a subdivision permit for 75 chemin Terry-Fox be amended to allow the creation of five (5) buildable lots, one (1) lot for the construction of a private road, and one (1) lot for park purposes, as shown on the revised plan prepared by Steve Tremblay, Land Surveyor, under minute 9659.

THAT the transfer of the lot to be conveyed as the parkland dedication shall be at the developer's expense and in favour of the Municipality.

THAT the Municipality pay the amount of \$6,839.00 as compensation for the excess area of lot 6 681 709 upon the execution of the transfer of title for that lot.

THAT the development agreement be amended to reflect the new proposed and approved lot numbers, in accordance with the plan prepared by Steve Tremblay, Land Surveyor, under minute 9659.

9.4 Minor variance – 1451 route 148 – lot 4 982 722

WHEREAS an application for a minor variance was submitted on June 19, 2026, concerning lot 4 982 722 of the Quebec Cadastre, located at 1451 route 148, to permit the



construction of a dwelling containing an additional dwelling unit with a floor area of 122.26 m²;

WHEREAS section 40 of zoning bylaw 11-24 provides that the floor area of an additional dwelling unit shall not exceed 90 m²;

WHEREAS the proposed construction project was designed and planned in 2021 in accordance with zoning bylaw 177-01, which permitted the additional dwelling unit to occupy the entire basement;

WHEREAS the layout of the construction plans does not allow the size of the additional dwelling unit to be reduced without substantial modifications to the plans, which would result in significant costs and compromise the functionality of the dwelling unit intended to meet the needs of the future occupants;

WHEREAS the additional dwelling unit will serve as an in-law suite to accommodate the applicant's parents;

WHEREAS the Planning Advisory Committee (PAC) recommended approval of the application at its meeting of June 30, 2026.

THEREFORE, it is moved by Councillor Dr. Jean Amyotte and seconded by Councillor Jean Côté.

AND RESOLVED THAT Council approve the application for a minor variance to permit the construction of a dwelling containing an additional dwelling unit with a floor area of 122.26 m², whereas the maximum permitted floor area for an additional dwelling unit is 90 m².
